





JULY'S LOVE OFFERING





The 16th Annual United Way/ FCPS Stuff the Bus Campaign is now underway. Each year generous Frederick County businesses and citizens help students start school with the necessary supplies that some families cannot provide. This year is no exception.

Supplies needed range from sturdy backpacks and composition books to loose-leaf paper, plastic pocket folders, glue sticks, rulers, safety scissors, pens and pencils, highlighters and erasers. Also requested are dry erase markers, earbuds, calculators, pencil sharpeners, crayons, colored pencils, zip lock bags and boxes of tissues. Backpacks are expensive so we purchase them in bulk. Earbuds with microphones are currently the most needed requirement for all ages.

Have you seen the big yellow school buses parked around the county? FCPS school buses will make stops at participating businesses to pick up donated school supplies. Community partner agencies will then assist in distributing the supplies

In 2023, over 250 bins of supplies were collected and thousands of items were purchased with donor gifts. The school supplies collected were distributed to over 3000 Frederick County students.

Here in the Middletown High School Feeder Area, MVPHP serves as a partner, collecting needed supplies and monetary donations. In early August our teams will work packing and distributing prefilled backpacks to children who are registered for the program on Friday, August 2, between 2:30 and 5:30 at the Middletown Volunteer Fire Department Activities Center.

Hope for the Deaf School – Liberia, West Africa

MUMC Mission SINCE 2009

MUMC gives the love of Christ to **The Hope for the Deaf School** in Liberia, West Africa. The Liberia government does not support schools for children who are deaf. While parents typically send their hearing children to school, they have been reluctant to send their deaf children to school due to costs and assignment to housework and stereotype that they may not benefit.



AUGUST GIVING FOR THIS MISSION:

- Love Offering donations. MUMC members donate to the schools operating expenses and scholarships. May be placed in Love Offering envelopes or checks written to MUMC (note on check: "Hope for the Deaf School").
- Used/new clothing. Summer clothing only for year-round wear; in children and young adult sizes. Including rain jackets, ponchos, and socks.
- Used/new shoes. Sneakers, sandals, rain shoes, soccer shoes; in child and adult sizes.
- **School supplies**. Such as wide-rule composition books (bound), pens, pencils, erasers, sharpeners, dry erase lap boards with lines on one side, fine point dry erase pens, dry erase erasers, reams of printer paper, art supplies, white chalk.
- Sewing supplies. Go thru your sewing closet, summer and cotton fabric, all sorts of supplies for hand and machine sewing, sewing machine in good working order. Also go to: Amazon Gift List, Hope School For <u>Deaf Skill Needs</u> (Registrant: Pat Thompson)

- Games for physical education. Deflated soccer/dodge/kick balls, frisbees, jump ropes, marbles. Also go to: Amazon Gift List, <u>Hope School For Deaf Games</u> (Registrant: Pat Thompson)
- **Toiletries**. Toothbrushes, toothpaste, hand soap, hand sanitizer.



BACKGROUND:

- UMC Missionaries. MUMC annually contributes toward the salaries of two missionaries: David Worlobah, Founder and Director of the s chool who has visited MUMC and taught at MUMC's Vacation Bible School; and Eric Drow, Assistant Director.
- **Deborah L. Hall School Building**. MUMC funded construction of a classroom building in 2009. The building is named after Debbie Hall, MUMC member and missions leader.
- **Rap Video**. MUMC's third mission trip to the school resulted in a rap video to change the country's perception of people who are deaf. Check it out! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HFmAx3zfqSc
- **Teacher training**. MUMC member Vickie Brown and Abby Thigpen, a teacher at Maryland School for the Deaf, trained 16 teachers of the deaf in Liberia and provided learning materials.

- **Mission Trips**. MUMC has had four mission trip to the school; a total of 13 MUMC members have gone and many other members supported these trips with preparations and funds. Most recent trip was 2019, before COVID.
- Vacation Bible School. MUMC teams developed and held VBS there in 2009 and 2012.
- **Ebola.** During the ebola crisis, 2014-2016, MUMC sent preventive supplies to the school for distribution. School staff traveled throughout Liberia to teach the deaf about prevention.

Online giving to MUMC

I'm writing this article to encourage you to consider contributing using the church's online giving tool if you haven't tried it. I've been attending MUMC for about 20 years, ever since our younger daughter was in middle school and played her flute with the church orchestra. I'm presently the chair of the MUMC Finance Committee.

When the pandemic began and I stayed home and worshiped by watching the services on my computer and phone, I started using the church's online giving tools to contribute to MUMC. At MUMC about ½ of collected offerings are given online, which matches current church giving patterns across the US and across denominations. I find giving online to be easier than writing checks, and easy to earmark my gifts to specify where the offering goes, and wanted to let you know how the process works.

I've also found that giving online is fast and safe, and my gifts have been accurately tabulated by MUMC in my annual year-end giving statement. I also receive email verification notifications immediately when I contribute.

But I realize that giving online is a solitary completely private effort. Unlike putting cash or a check in the offering plate, your children don't see what you're doing to help the church. Unless you tell them or demonstrate by dropping the card in the offering plate saying you give online, the next generation won't learn your habit and the importance of giving. You're setting an example of being a faithful giver, so be sure to talk about what you're doing.

Here's how it works when I'm using a laptop:

- 1) I go to the MUMC home webpage at: https://www.mtownumc.org/
- 2) At the very bottom of the home page is a picture of a wheat field ripe for harvest, and a box at the bottom labeled "Donate Now"
- 3) Clicking on the "Donate Now" box goes to https://secure.myvanco.com/YP3W/home
- 4) This page is run by Vanco to collect online donations. It is specific to MUMC. As of mid April, there are fifteen categories you can select for your gift.
- 5) For example, if the "Blooms for Beds" choice is selected, your money will go to funding the construction of bunk beds for children in the Frederick area who do not have their own bed. Selecting "Donate Now" brings you to a page asking how much you want to donate and if you want your gift in honor or memory of someone. You can select "add to basket" if you wish to give money in other categories.
- 6) You can select another option, or go to the next step labeled "Continue to payment." If you wish to give to another category, you can select "See all" to return to the list of 15 choices. For example, if you then select "Pledged offering" the new page will ask for the dollar amount, if this is a one time donation or a recurring donation, and the specific date you want to give. You can then select another giving option, or pick "Continue to payment."

- 7) On the payment page, you can pick the option to pay by credit card, or to pay from your checking or saving account. The first time you donate online you need to fill in your credit card information or bank account and bank routing number, as well as your name and address and contact information.
- On this page you have the option to cover the processing fees. For credit cards, the church is billed 3% of your donation. For gifts from your bank account, the cost is 1%, So for your gift of \$10, you have the option to pay \$10.10 if the money is being withdrawn from your checking account.
- 9) Selecting "Continue to review" shows the exact amount you've decided to give to each category and the last four digits of your account number.
- 10) Selecting "Donate now" processes your donation. You'll get an immediate confirmation on the next page, as well as an immediate email sent to the email address you provided. Today's online verification message said: "Thanks for your support, Steve! You will receive details at (youremail) Share Middletown United Methodist Church Your support makes a difference."
- 11) The email receipt will come from Support@Vanco.com.

The email message I received reads: "Middletown United Methodist Church Thank you for your support! Hello Steve, you can review a summary of your items and payment information below. We thank you for your generosity." The amount you gave and the categories will be detailed as well as the last four digits of your payment method.

And here's how giving online works from my Android phone. It looks like identical method.

- 1) I start at the MUMC website at mtownumc.org.
- 2) Like using a laptop computer, the phone shows the online giving button at the bottom of the webpage just below the picture of the wheatfield. Clicking on the "Donate Now" button takes me to the Vanco link that is specific to our Middletown United Methodist Church. I scroll down through the giving choices to find where you would like to donate. For that choice, you select "Give Now."
- 3) This pulls up a screen asking you to fill in the dollar amount, if this is a one time or a recurring gift. If it is a one time gift, it asks you if you wish to give right now or on a later date. Pressing "Add to Basket" brings you to the menu to select "Continue to payment" or "Explore more ways to give, see all options.
- 4) Selecting "Continue to payment" asks if you want to pay with a credit card or a withdrawal from a bank account. As with online giving from a laptop, you can enter in the credit card or bank account information. Or, if you've set up an account with Vanco you provide your email and password. The webpage will have you select the credit card or bank account, and then ask if you wish to cover the processing fee. Pressing "Submit" will give you an instant "Thanks for your support" message on your phone, and an instant email with your receipt verifying the gift.

I realize this can be confusing the first time you attempt to give an online contribution. I'd be glad to help walk you through the steps over the phone without asking any of your confidential information. If you'd like my non-professional help, please send me an email. We will see how people can make peace and help others to belong through compromise and adaptability. These actions can take great courage. Often someone needs to give a little first so that a compromise is possible. Before suggesting a compromise, we need spend time thinking and praying about a problem and what might be a just way to resolve it.


When you are a child, it can be hard to believe that you can put your faith into action because there are so many things that you can't do on your own. However, all of us, including children, are acting on our faith in little ways each day of our lives. Often, we don't notice when we are doing the things that our faith has taught us. Our faith can show up in big ways or in small actions that are equally important but may go unnoticed.

Spiritual Practice for Adults

This summer, help your children gain awareness of their faith in action by being aware. See how your child responds in various situations, and how you respond in various ways. Try to catch your child showing courage, peacemaking or helping others belong, praise them for how they are showing their faith. Help your child see the ways that these qualities show up the Bible stories of people who helped others feel a sense of belonging and who showed courage in their faith. Encourage your children to seek out courageous ways to be peacemakers, or help others belong.

Is there a situation in your life that needs compromise? Spend some time thinking about how you can bring peace through justice by compromising in a difficult situation. Can you courageously work to find peace? to help someone feel they belong.




Summer Study

Life in first-century Palestine was very different from our world today, and many traditional interpretations of Jesus' stories ignore this disparity and have often allowed anti-Semitism and misogyny to color their perspectives. In this wise, entertaining, and educational book, Amy-Jill Levine offers a fresh, timely reinterpretation of Jesus' narratives.

In *Short Stories by Jesus*, she analyzes these "problems with parables," taking readers back in time to understand how their original Jewish audience understood them. Levine reveals the parables' connections to first-century economic and agricultural life, social customs and morality, Jewish scriptures and Roman culture. With this revitalized understanding, she interprets these moving stories for the contemporary reader, showing how the parables are not just about Jesus, but are also about us—and when read rightly, still challenge and provoke us two thousand years later. 



PROJECT LINUS – Volunteers of All Ages Needed



Project Linus began in December 1995 by a woman inspired to make blankets for her local children's cancer center. It is named after the adorable security blanket toting character from the *Peanuts*© comic strip. Creator Charles Schulz was aware of the efforts and was delighted to have *Linus* inspire blanket makers to help comfort children in need. Since then, Project Linus has expanded to a nationwide non-profit organization with chapters in every state dedicated to donating handmade blankets for babies and children 0-18 who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need.

The Frederick County MD chapter of Project Linus was launched in October 2017 and meets regularly at Middletown United Methodist Church (MUMC) on the first Saturday of each month. Janice Crogan (plfredcounty@gmail.com) is the current Frederick County Chapter Coordinator. Please contact her for more information.

The mission of Project Linus is two-fold. First, to provide love and a sense of security, warmth, and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need through the gifts of new handmade blankets, quilts, and afghans that are lovingly created by volunteer "blanketeers." Second, to provide a rewarding and fun service opportunity for interested individuals and groups in local communities.

<u>Community involvement is vital to the success of Project Linus as all chapters are run SOLELY by do-</u> nations and volunteers. You can help make a difference in the life of a child by:

Volunteering

Volunteers are needed for a variety of jobs. You can help by making blankets or by attending a blanket-making day to see how you can help. "Blankeeters" meet the first Saturday of each month at MUMC from 10 a.m.-12 p.m. All ages are welcome and anyone who can tie a knot, use scissors, use a sewing machine, **or** count is invited to join the fun. We make blankets, give demonstrations and support, label and inspect donated blankets, and sort and prepare blankets for distribution to local agencies (e.g., hospitals, surgical centers, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, Children Advocacy Center, Camp Jamie). Scout troops and teenagers that need community service hours are always welcome.

Become a "Blanketeer" (make a blanket)

All blanket styles are welcome, including quilts, tied comforters, fleece blankets, crocheted or knitted afghans, and receiving blankets in child-friendly colors. They may be worked on or made at a regular meeting at MUMC or made at home. Always remember that blankets must be new, hand-made, washable, free of pins, and come from smoke-free environments due to allergy reasons. Just like children who come in all sizes, so do our blankets.

- Baby size 36" x 36", child size 45" x 60", and teen size 60" x 72".
- The most popular blanket is a single layer, no-sew fleece blanket approximately 54" x 60" (uses 1½ yards of fleece).
- Finished blankets may be brought to a monthly meeting at MUMC or dropped off at JoAnn's in Frederick or Patches Quilting and Sewing in Mt. Airy.

Make a Donation

Monetary donations or donations of supplies/materials that can be used to make blankets are always needed. Additionally, gift cards to stores that sell blanket-making materials (JoAnn's, Walmart, etc.) are welcome.
