


The season of Easter, or Eastertide, can be difficult to navigate. On the one hand, there is the ongoing unexplainable joy of Resurrection and the hope of new life. Count them...375 bags! That's how many bags were filled and distributed in our community this year!!! We started the program in 2022, on a leap of faith, with 200 bags and it's already grown to 375!!!

Those who receive our bags just before Valentine's Day felt blessed, surprised, and even astonished that they were nominated. Some of you nominated a neighbor, a grandparent, a teacher, or friend. Others nominated included the residents of Vindabona, the Fire Fighters in Middletown and Braddock Heights, clients of Middletown Valley People Helping People and some of our own seniors. Our Preschool and KidsClub students made cards and decorated bags. We held a card making session after church in early February where nearly 50 people showed up! Countless others donated chocolate, gloves, seeds, lotion, chap stick, tea lights and more. For each person who donated items, nominated recipients, made valentines, decorated bags, filled them and distributed them, we give thanks!

I wanted to share some comments from one of our recipients. She and her son were recovering from COVID and had been stuck in the house for two weeks when I dropped off their bags. She was overwhelmed and very pleased to receive a bag. She studied each and every item in it. Prayed for all who made the bags possible and felt a very special connection to a young girl named Nora who made one of the cards she received. She had never met Nora and only knows her through her artwork and words of love, yet she feels blessed by Nora and everyone involved in our Blast of Love. She gives her heartfelt thanks and even made a point of telling me she's looking forward to planting the seeds she received and remembering us each time she looks at the flowers this summer.

Staff at Vindabona have conveyed their sincere thanks to Pastor Katie. They indicated not only were the residents thrilled when they received the bags, some even delighted in showing all the items to people who visit their rooms. The nursing staff who distributed the bags felt joy in being part of our event!





Sunday School News for April 2024.

April's faith word is SHARE.

Sharing not only our worldly goods, but also our time, energy, stories, attention, attitudes, and faith.

Students will learn about Jesus' Great Commission to go and baptize, teach, and serve others; then how Peter and John shared what they had - healing outside the temple; and how the early disciples sharing *everything* they had; finally, about and the twelve disciples choose seven more to help with the early church.


A Christian community is to embody Jesus' presence in the world to strengthen and guide God's children. To address the many needs of His children, God commissions us in many ways. A commission is a call to something God needs someone to do. It's like being on a mission with Jesus, a co-mission. We do this in many ways; some seemly small, like a genuine smile to someone who feels alone, or seemly big, such as starting a new ministry. And in all things, we can show respect, love, and gentleness. Serving, teaching, and baptizing were central actions in Jesus' ministry, just as they are central to our calling as followers of Christ. Jesus promises to go with us always, even when we doubt, as we carry out His Great Commission.

Spiritual Practice for Adults

This month, reflect your commission. How can you work with Jesus to bring God's kingdom to earthly reality? Nothing is too small or too big for God. Is there something specific that you feel God is calling you to do? Even if you don't know, take some time to think and pray about it. If you think you know that to do, talk to someone about it. If you are ready to move forward, write a plan.

ADULT BIBLE STUDIES

New Study Begins April 7



As a child, Elias Chacour lived in a small Palestinian village in Galilee. When tens of thousands of Palestinians were killed and nearly one million forced into refugee camps in 1948, Elias began a long struggle with how to respond. In *Blood Brothers*, he blends his riveting life story with historical research to reveal a little-known side of the Arab-Israeli conflict, exploring whether bitter enemies can ever be reconciled. This book offers hope and insight to help each of us learn to live at peace in a world of tension and terror. Chacour, a former Archbishop of the Melkite Greek Catholic Church, has built a university, li-

braries, community centers, and youth clubs throughout Israel's Galilee region to create dynamic bridges of reconciliation between Palestinians and Jews. He has been nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize three times and travels the world as an ambassador of peace.

This study of *Blood Brothers: The Dramatic Story of a Palestinian Christian Working for Peace in Israel* (2013 version) begins April 7 and runs through May 19. 




MUMC's United Women in Faith

Following a brief business meeting the group reviews portions of a book they are reading. Our current study is *Beating Guns: Hope for People Who are Weary of Violence* by Shaine Claiborne and Michael Martin. Inspired by the pro-

phetic image of beating swords into plows, *Beating Guns* provides a provocative look at gun violence in America and offers a clarion call to change our hearts regarding one of the most significant moral issues of our time. Bestselling author, speaker, and activist Shane Claiborne and Michael Martin show why Christians should be concerned about gun violence and how they can be part of the solution. The authors transcend stale rhetoric and old debates about gun control to offer a creative and productive response. Full-color images show how guns are being turned into tools and musical instruments across the nation. Charts, tables, and facts convey the mind-boggling realities of gun violence in America, but as the authors make clear, there is a story behind every statistic. *Beating Guns* allows victims and perpetrators of gun violence to tell their own compelling stories, offering hope for change and helping us reimagine the world as one that turns from death to life, where swords become plows and guns are turned into garden tools. Participants are asked to read Chapters 10-14 before the April 14th meeting. United Women in Faith is open to all women, of all ages who wish to be in a fellowship of women who study issues that affect women, children, and youth. 

GARDEN HELPERS WANTED

It's that time of year again. We're looking for volunteers to help care for the church flowerbeds, and memorial gardens. Please prayerfully consider signing up for a week to keep our grounds looking good through the spring, summer and fall.

Weekly Garden Schedule for MUMC

Please sign up to volunteer to tend to our Memorial Garden and all the flower bed areas around the church building. Sign up for any week, beginning in May and ending in October, Sunday through Saturday. You can come as often as every day and during any time of the day that works best for you, or you can pick a day of the week that works with your schedule and accomplish everything in one day. It's up to you. We appreciate any and all help that we can get to maintain the beauty of the grounds.

Your responsibilities will include:

- 1. Water pots (Preferably daily) and gardens depending on rainfall.
- 2. Deadhead flowers (spent blooms).
- 3. Tidy up the rock area & mulch. Make sure mulch and rocks are in beds not on walkways.
- 4. While watering the flower, also add water to the fountain rock- there is a small reservoir under the rock that tends to evaporate on hot days and damages the motor. *Disregard adding water for fountain until further notice (fountain not working currently)
- 5. Weed all gardens.
- 6. Remove any trash from the area.
- 7. Sweep sidewalks/brick areas as needed.

MUMC Composts!

Did you know MUMC has been composting kitchen scraps, dead altar flowers and other things for more than five years? Well, we have! It has always been a low-key effort. Originally, I took the bucket to my home compost pile every week, and when I moved to an apartment another member took over the task. However, things got a bit complicated

during the pandemic when we weren't in the building (or very few of us were) and the bucket rarely got emptied. For more than a year, Peggy Bishop has quietly, and faithfully, picked up the bag in the bucket and dropped it off every week at the Key City Compost Bin in the parking lot at Middletown's Memorial Park. Many of us feel it's time to spread this opportunity to more members and are inviting you to sign up to do so one or more Sunday's during the year using the following link: https://www.signupgenius.com/go/30E0E4BACAB2AABFC1-46718820-mumc.

The orange 5-gallon compost bucket is located under the island in the kitchen, off the Social Hall. There is a box, next to the bucket, of compostable bags to line the bucket once you remove the full (or partially full one). If you need to take the whole bucket, please move the 2nd bucket forward and return the bucket you're taking as soon as possible. The bag of compost can either be taken to your own home compost pile or to the bin in the parking lot at Memorial Park in Middletown (next to the Medical Offices). If the box of replacement bags is running low, leave a message for me in the office. This continues to be a low-key effort that is beneficial to the planet because it keeps methane producing waste out of landfills and converts that waste to soil. Let's keep this effort going and get more members involved. It's something that can easily be handled on Sunday, after services, and is a great way to teach our children one important way to care for God's very good creation!
